What is Easter?

Easter is a special holiday for Catholics that celebrates Jesus Christ coming back to life after being crucified. According to Catholic history, Jesus was crucified on a Friday called Good Friday and then rose from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Easter is a significant event for Catholics as it represents the end of the period called Lent, which lasts for 40 days. During Lent, Catholics engage in fasting, prayer, and acts of penance. Easter is regarded as the most sacred day of the year for Catholics.


When is Easter?

Easter is a special holiday that doesn't have a fixed date every year. Instead, its date changes. Nowadays, all Catholic churches follow the same method to determine when Easter will take place. It is celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon that occurs on or after 21st March. This means Easter can fall in either March or April, with the earliest possible date being 22nd March and the latest being 11th April.

What is the history of Easter?

Easter, which commemorates the resurrection of Jesus, has its origins in the year when Jesus was crucified, nearly 2000 years ago.

Easter is a joyous celebration that signifies Jesus' victory over death through his resurrection. It is deeply intertwined with the arrival of spring, symbolising new life and the end of the cold winter season.



Why is Easter significant for Catholics?

The resurrection of Jesus is the cornerstone of Catholic faith and forms the foundation of Catholicism. According to Catholic beliefs, Jesus was arrested by the Romans because he openly declared himself to be the son of God.

After being arrested, Jesus was sentenced to death by Pontius Pilate. However, his resurrection is considered by Catholics as evidence of his divinity and his identity as the son of God. The four gospels in the New Testament affirm that those who have faith in Jesus' death and resurrection will be granted entry into the 'Kingdom of Heaven' and will receive the 'gift of eternal life'.


Catholics hold the belief that Jesus' ultimate sacrifice was an integral part of a divine plan to redeem and save humanity. It is believed that through his death, Jesus restored the damaged relationship between humanity and God. This restoration is commonly referred to as the Atonement.

What is Holy Week?

The week preceding Easter Sunday is commonly referred to as Holy Week in the Catholic tradition. The key events during Holy Week include:

Holy Wednesday -	This day commemorates Judas' betrayal of Jesus.
Maundy Thursday -	This day is significant as it marks the occasion when Jesus and his
	disciples shared the Last Supper together.
Good Friday -	This day commemorates the Crucifixion of Jesus.
Easter Sunday -	This day marks the resurrection of Jesus.
